<b>Position:</b>	Rules and Umpiring Officer
<b>Main Purpose:</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>✓ To ensure all members of the NZWLA (Players and Officials) have a full understanding of the current women's FIL rules and also to develop the number of well- trained umpires in New Zealand.</li> </ul>
<b>Role:</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>✓ Communicating with FIL Committee Chair – Rules</li> <li>✓ Sharing FIL Rules Nationwide</li> <li>✓ Growing umpiring in NZ</li> </ul>

<b>Principal Responsibilities and Duties:</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>✓ Direct communication with FIL regarding FIL rules and changing of rules</li> <li>✓ Ensure rules are enforced nationwide (especially key in relation to National reps having good understanding of FIL rules)</li> <li>✓ Liaise with Rules and Umpiring Contacts in regions regarding facilitating local training sessions</li> <li>✓ Develop an umpiring accreditation program which will allow experienced umpires to acknowledge their skill and invite new umpires to better their knowledge. Umpiring sessions should take place bi-annually to allow new umpires to gain accreditation and ensure more experienced umpires are bought up to date</li> </ul>
